
day and not seeing any movement for over 8 hours. Jim Grubba gave him a conservative score of 152 1/2". Josh Borrow






The guys were hard at it replacing the indoor shooting wall in November. Thanks Jason Birchmeier, Rocky Cummins, Jeff DeWyse, Doug Dunning and Frank Lechota for replacing the shooting wall!

Please remember to take care of your targets when you are done shooting the inside range. We do this because it makes the shooting wall last longer. It is important we move targets around so we don't shoot the same spots all the time. If the targets are kept in the same spot, it will create a hole, and that is not good.

If you find it hard to pull your arrow out of the new wall, use the white tubes on the red bow holders to lubricate the tips of your arrows and you will find it much easier to pull the arrow out of the bales.

Seniors age 62 and up, benefit from reduced dues at Flint Bowmen. Everything is cut in half! Your annual dues without any work hours are \$65; with your 20 work hours, your dues are \$25. If you are a senior, but you aren't getting a discount on your dues – then let me know. I won't ask anyone their age! To receive the senior discount on your dues, you have to be 62 as of December 31, 2023. This is not automatic – you have to let me know! If you already receive the senior discount on your dues, you don't have to do anything to continue receiving it. The senior discount is not retroactive, so be sure to tell me before the end of the year!

Aging Out of your Family Membership

Flint Bowmen memberships are family memberships and per Flint Bowmen Bylaws, you are considered to be a child through the age of 18. Children age out of the family membership when they turn 19. As of their 19th birthday, they must have their own membership to be at Flint Bowmen and receive all the benefits of a Flint Bowmen Membership.

In addition, children that age-out of their parent's Family Membership, have 1-year from the date of their birthday to join Flint Bowmen at a discounted rate of only \$50. That is a savings of \$80! After their first calendar year as members, they will be subject to the full current dues rate less any work hours performed up to the (20) work hours allowed for a discount on dues.

Of course, 19-year olds can still come to Flint Bowmen as a guest, but they will have to pay non-member fees. Letters will be going out soon to families with children that have or will age-out in 2024. If you have any questions, please email me.


