

Flint Bowmen spring 3-D leagues start Tuesday, April 23, with registration from 10A.M. until 12P.M., Tuesday-Thursday, 4P.M. until 7P.M. The cost for members is \$10.00 and non-members \$12.00 per week. (Discounts for kids and senior members over 62.) Bring your friends and family members and have some fun in the woods.

What is a Flint Bowmen 3-D League?

"A 3-D league is 8 weeks of hunting without the dragging or getting your hands dirty."

The Flint Bowmen 3-D leagues utilize our four 3-D courses on our 28 plus acres. We have at multiple elevated platforms that simulate hunting opportunities on each of our courses. We set up different animal targets at twenty locations for shooters to test their skills. Each shooter gets one chance to make the best shot they can for score. If you miss though, you do get a zero so make your shot count. The league runs for eight weeks, rain or shine!

All of our leagues are open to the public. Many men, women and kids enjoy these leagues every year. We have several classifications to accommodate many shooting styles. Some shooters have no interest in hunting, but still enjoy the challenge of shooting at the animal targets in the woods.

We do allow all kinds of bows because we have classifications for all of them. We want people who shoot long bows, recurves, compounds and cross bows to come out and enjoy themselves in the woods with whatever they want to shoot.

The 3-D leagues at Flint Bowmen use a multi-stake system. We have white and purple stakes for the kids and beginner adults, but if those stake are too far, please move up to where you can shoot comfortably. All of our animal targets should have backstops behind the animals in case the shooter misses.

We have many additional stakes for the adults. The orange stake is considered the bow hunter stake. It is meant to represent a shot one might take while bow hunting. The distance is usually from 5 to 30 yards.

We have other stakes to test the advanced archery shooter who would want a more challenging 3-D shot. These shots **could** be anywhere from 5 to about 50 yards.

All of our leagues use a handicap system to make things fair no matter one's skill level. We also use a 'flighted' system so shooters will, in the end, only be shooting against shooters of their own skill level. If the shooter is good enough or lucky enough to win, they will be rewarded with a plaque or trophy at a banquet at the end of the league.

Over the years, we have had many members and non-members credit their hunting success to the experience that our 3-D leagues have given them. By shooting the 3-D league, you will be well practiced in just about every shot that could happen when you see the real thing in the fall.

Don't forget the Spring 3-D league begins Tuesday, April 23.


help, set up target help, and take down target help.




